## Torquing Your Jaguar's Wheel Lugs

It's not only important it can be critical

Ever wonder why all those little British cars including Minis, MGs and Austin Healey Sprites came with those wimpy little lug wrenches. There was a good reason. People have always had a tendency to over tighten lug nuts thinking the tighter the better to keep my wheel from falling off. **WRONG!** The small lug wrench that came with those small cars was small intentionally, and not just so they would fit in the tool kit that came with the car. They were small to keep you from over tightening the tiny lug nuts and possibly twisting off a wheel stud. How many of us have used a long bar attached to the miniature-sized lug wrench and ended up with 3 instead of 4 lugs? So, there's one good reason to use a torque wrench. Another is that incorrectly tightened wheel nuts can contribute to or even cause warping of the brake rotors, resulting in very expensive repair.

Torque wrenches are widely available and not expensive. Be sure to buy one with the correct range of torque values. The "click" type are easier to use, but pay attention, when it clicks stop tightening.

The correct torque values may be found in your owner's manual, although it's more likely you'll have to refer to the shop manual. The values are for clean and dry threads. Applying oil, grease or anti-seize to the threads will result in inaccurate torque values and over-tightened nuts. If you can't find specific torque values for your car, use the

following: 12mm studs = 75 ft lbs 14mm studs = 85 ft lbs 7/16" studs = 75 ft lbs 1/2" studs = 80 ft lbs


The threads should be clean and free of burrs, so you can turn the nuts by hand until they are seated finger tight against the wheel. Then use the torque wrench to tighten the nuts in a criss-cross sequence to ensure the forces are applied evenly.

Lastly, be sure your Jaguar's wheel nuts are torqued properly, even if you don't do it yourself. No, make that especially if you don't do it yourself. NEVER let the guy at the tire shop use his pneumatic wrench to tighten your jag's lug nuts. He'll want to because it's quick and easy, not because it's right. I've found that most will use the pneumatic wrench to snug the nuts down then use a "click" torque wrench to get the final torque especially when he knows you are watching him. Tell him the torque values and ensure that he uses the proper settings.
